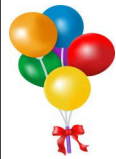

### Ad resurgendum cum Christo

#### The burial of the deceased and the conservation of ashes in the case of cremation

The Church wants to make sure that those Catholics who choose cremation are aware that the remains of the deceased are to be shown the same public veneration as with those who choose burial, *i.e.* that the cremated remains of the deceased should be buried and not scattered and should not be conserved in the house.

As baptised members of the church, the People of God, we have been sealed with the mark of the Blessed Trinity. As members of the church we belong to God. In baptism we became God's adopted children and we all became brothers and sisters in the Lord. We are one family. We are not the private property of anyone family or individual. Keeping ashes at home maybe a sign of love and grief, but equally it shows a lack of understanding of how the deceased loved one belonged to the entire community of faith and not just to his or her closest relatives.

In death, the whole Church community has the right to mourn and remember the faithful departed. Special emphasis is placed on the marked grave where people can come and pray. The name of the deceased was given in Baptism, and is their concrete identity. We should not hide this identity by placing our loved ones in an unmarked place. Their name is important, it was given to them in Baptism and is the name through which God chose them and called them to himself.

The funeral rites of the church are equally important. The Requiem Mass is not a private Mass for the deceased, but part of our Catholic common and public worship. The family of the deceased should be sensitive to the sacredness of the Liturgy. There is a danger of creating a church in our own image. Secularised and individualistic fashions try and take hold of the

### The use of Black Vestments

Black signifies mourning, but not simply mourning in general, rather black directs us in a particular way to mourn and pray for the dead. While white is a colour of festivity and rejoicing, purple the colour which signifies penance for our *own* wretchedness and calls us to do penance for our *own* sins, black on the other hand helps direct us to mourn not for ourselves but for the deceased. The colour reminds us to pray for the dead. The use of black vestments is *authentically* Catholic. It is another example of our liturgy reinforcing our theology. *Lex orandi, lex credenda, as we pray, so we believe.*

Nearly every prayer in the funeral liturgy is for the forgiveness of the deceased sins'. Wearing white vestments, the colour of festivity for a Requiem Mass rather than the colour of prayerful mourning sends out a message that Purgatory is not real. Why pray for the dead or even offer Mass for the dead if you think they are already in heaven?
